Monday, April 23, 2012 Nashville Unplugged 6pm-10pm

Get a taste of downtown Nashville nightlife by taking this trip. You will be taken to 2nd Avenue where the heart of Nashville pulses. You will be able to pick and choose between a variety of restaurants and clubs to experience.

Among a few are: BB Kings, Wildhorse Saloon, Buffalo Billiards, Bourbon Street Blues Club. The cost of the tour includes transportation. Meet in the lobby at 5:45pm to experience downtown Nashville. \$25 per person



Tuesday, April 24th Cheekwood Botanical Gardens 10am-2pm



The history and origin of Cheekwood are intimately interwoven with the growth of Nashville, the Maxwell House coffee brand and the Cheeks, one of the city's early entrepreneurial families. The Cheekwood is a 55-acre botanical garden and art museum located on the historic Cheek estate. The fifty-five acre site includes the original Cheek gardens, pools, fountains, statuary, extensive boxwood plantings and breathtaking views of the rolling Tennessee hills. We will begin with a guided tour of the diverse art collection, dine in the Pineapple Room Restaurant that overlooks the beautiful west lawn, and meander through the botanical gardens. This tour includes transportation and admission to the Cheekwood. Lunch will be on your own. Meet us in the lobby at 9:45am. \$35 per person

Tuesday, April 24th Tour for the History Buffs 10am-2pm

The pivotal Battle of Stones River began on New Year's Eve in 1862 and lasted three days. When the smoke cleared, there were more than 23,000 casualties, making this one of the bloodiest battles fought west of the Appalachians. The 650-acre National Battlefield includes Stones River National Cemetery, established in 1865, with more than 6,000 Union graves; and the Hazen Brigade Monument, believed to be the oldest, intact Civil War monument still standing in its original location. Oakland's Historic House Museum is a graceful mansion that was caught in the crossfire of the Civil War and was used as a camp by both the Union and Confederate armies. We will be having lunch at the City Café, which has been serving delicious southern meat since February 10, 1900. The cost of this tour includes transportation and admission. Lunch will be on your own. Meet us in the lobby at 9:45am for this tour that will take you back in time. \$40 per person



Friday, April 27th Facility Tour at Adams Place 10am-1pm

Adams Place offers three tiers of care for older adults on one 22 acre beautiful campus. This community is located outside of Nashville in Murfreesboro, Tennessee. The group will tour the three tiers of care and conclude with having lunch in their dining room. Lunches will be offered \$3-\$5 per person. Meet us in the lobby at 9:45am to experience a facility that has earned a great reputation in Middle Tennessee for offering excellent services with a caring and talented staff.

Saturday, April 28th Grand Ole Opry 6pm-10pm

The unique art form we call country music owes its phenomenal rise in popularity to a live show that began 85 years ago called the Grand Ole Opry. The tradition is stronger than ever today, as several times each week the Opry presents a live show with an ever-changing mix of famous and soon-to-be famous talent sharing the stage. At the Opry, you can count on things happening you just can't wait to see.

The show begins at 7 pm so make sure you meet in the lobby at 5:45pm. We encourage participants to eat before the tour. Transportation and tickets are included. \$70 per person.
